Cowley County 4-H Day is Saturday, February 13th at the Winfield Middle School. (130 Viking Blvd)

It is helpful to arrive at the Winfield Middle School at least 15 minutes prior to your scheduled presentation. If the room is running ahead of schedule and you would like to present early, you are welcome to do so. However, we would never force a member to present prior to their scheduled time. We ask that presenters arrive promptly and pay careful attention to time out of respect for the judges and other presenters.

You will enter the Commons Area of Winfield Middle School. An information table will be available directing you to the rooms that the performances will take place in. Results will also be posted near the information table.

When you arrive at the room in which you are scheduled to present, please check in with the room monitor so that they know you are there. You are welcome and encouraged to listen to other members present. Please be courteous: Listen to the entire presentation without leaving, sit quietly and do not attempt to enter a room while someone else is presenting.

Once you have completed your presentation, you are encouraged to visit with the judge. The judge may ask you questions and/or offer advice. Answer honestly and openly. They are here to give feedback and help us to improve. Be respectful of those presenting after you and quickly clean up your area before conferencing with the judge.

South Central District Horse Show



District Horse Shows are the qualifying event for the Kansas State Fair 4-H Horse Show. If a 4-H member would like to have the opportunity to compete at the state level in the Horse Project, they must receive a purple or blue ribbon at their district show.

All 4-H Horse Project members who are 9 years old before January 1, 2016 are eligible to compete at the South Central District Horse Show if they have completed the following: 1) Horse Identification Certificate updated and on file with the local (Cowley County) Extension Office by May 1, 2016; 2) Complete and pass Level 1 Horse Achievement Level Test prior to entry deadline for the district show; 3)

Complete online entry and payment prior to June 15, 2016.

The 2016 The South Central District Horse Show will be held July 1, 2016 on the Kansas State Fairgrounds in Hutchinson. Entries will be completed online and additional information will be released in April. Entries are due June 15, 2016.

2016 Fair Updates

Each year, the Cowley County Extension Office accepts suggestions for changes and updates to the 4-H division of the Cowley County Fair.

Suggestions are considered by the 4-H Youth Development Program Development Committee (4-H PDC) and sent for final approval by the Extension Council Executive Board and the Cowley County Fairboard.

The following are updates for the 2016 Cowley County Fair.

*Swine may weigh as soon as they arrive; no earlier than 8:00 a.m.

*Change Swine Rule #5: All Breed Champion and Breed Reserve

Champion Market Hogs will be sold through the Market Livestock Sale or at base bid and must be slaughtered.

New Rule: The Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Market Hogs will be sold through the Market Livestock Sale or at base bid and must be slaughtered.

*Changes to show classes will not be allowed within 2 hours of the show beginning.

*During the Swine show, exhibitors will be limited to one helper in the holding area.

*Change Dairy Rule #4: A cow, in order to be eligible to be shown, must have been the property of the exhibitor as a calf, as a yearling, or must have been owned by the exhibitor through at least one complete lactation previous to this show.

New Rule: A cow, in order to be eligible to be shown, must have been owned or leased by the exhibitor as a calf or a heifer.

*A Bred and Owned class will be added to Dairy Cattle.

*Change Dairy Rule 7: Milking Cow Classes may be brought at 9:00 a.m. day of show and released at 5:00 p.m. day of show. All other dairy cattle entries shall be in place on Thursday at 5:30 p.m.

New Rule: Milking Cow Classes may be brought the day of the show by 10:00 a.m. and released after completion of the Dairy Cattle show. All other dairy cattle entries shall be in place on Thursday at 5:30 p.m.

*Change Dairy Rule #7: In case the number of entries justify, as determined by the superintendent, the Yearling Heifer class may be divided into Junior and Senior Heifers, and the cow class into two-year-olds or over.

New Rule: In case the number of entries justify, as determined by the superintendent, the heifer and cow classes may be combined or divided as needed.

*Registered and Commercial Doe classes will be added to Meat Goats.

*Ownership deadline for all breeding livestock is June 1 of the current 4-H year.

*Meat Goats are NOT required to be born after January 1.

*The Rabbit Show will begin at 6:00 p.m. Friday.

*Entomology rules will be updated with the updated Kansas State Fair rules.
