4-H promotion and recruitment don't end when 4-H Week is over. When new families and visitors come to your club meeting, help to make them feel welcome. Greet them and introduce yourself, find out a little about them and help them to make connections with others who October 2016

share a similar interest. Remember the following to help make your new friends feel welcome:

- Greet people as they come in the door. If your Community Leader or officers are busy helping others, take the initiative to meet new people and make them feel welcome.

- Take the first step and introduce yourself.

- Introduce new families to returning 4-H families.

- Explain what goes on in the club meeting each month.

- Offer help throughout the year.

- Involve visitors in club activities.

- Send a "thank you" or welcome note after their first club visit.
