# Cowley County 4-H Fair Book Update

We're excited to offer a customized fair book for your family. Early in June, your household will receive an e-mail with a link to select your 4-H projects. You will then receive an e-mail with all 4-H fairbook sections sent directly to you. You can print or save this document for your use. Printed copies of the complete fairbook will no longer be available (but individual sections will be posted on the Cowley 4-H website).

All 4-H pre-entries will be due **Tuesday**, **July 6** using the online system we've used in the past. All families will be mailed a letter with pre-entry reminders, a project list and the link for the online entries.

# <u>4-H Foodstand</u>

The money raised in the Food Stand is used to support our 4-H programs through scholarships to state 4-H events, transportation to county camp and Discovery Days, volunteer development awards and recognition at Achievement Night, officer training and much more. Here is the schedule of workers for the Food Stand at the Cowley County Fair. An additional Thursday evening shift has been added. 4-H alumni generously give of their time to help raise money for 4-H during this shift. However, current 4-H families are welcome and encouraged to work during this time.

Please assign at least 5 adults to each shift. They are needed to run the cash register, operate the grill and appliances, and help with food preparation.

Each club is REQUIRED to have a shift manager. The shift manager must be a responsible adult or teen. Shift managers should recruit workers, view the shift manager orientation video and turn a list of volunteers in to the Extension Office by Thursday, July 22nd.

# Livestock Ownership Requirements

In order to exhibit livestock at the Cowley County Fair, members must meet the following ownership/leasing deadlines.

<u>Market Steers/Market Heifers:</u> Must be owned by March 7, 2021 and tagged with official Cowley County Extension issued tag/weighed at official beef weigh-in. <u>Breeding Heifers, Gilts, Does and Ewes:</u> Must be owned by the exhibitor by April 27, 2021. Registered females may be co-owned/co-registered by two or more members in the same family. Registration must be in the name(s) of the exhibitor(s) by May 1, 2021.

Commercial females must have a 4-H eartag.

<u>Second Year Bucket Calves:</u> Must be tagged with Bucket Calf tag. Market calves must be tagged by March 7, 2021 at the official weigh-in.

<u>Bucket Calves:</u> Must be born between January 1 and May 31, 2021.

<u>Swine:</u> Market and Swine must be owned and nominated by April 27, 2021. Market Swine must be born after December 1, 2020.

<u>Market Lambs</u>: Market Lambs must be born after January 1, 2021. Lambs must be owned and nominated by April 27, 2021.

<u>Market Meat Goats:</u> Market Meat Goats must be owned, nominated by April 27, 2021. Market Meat Goats must still have their milk teeth at the fair.

<u>Dairy Cattle:</u> Must be owned or leased by the exhibitor at least 100 days before the fair. All lease, registration and/or transfer papers must be in the name of the exhibitor by June 15, 2021.

Dairy Goats: Registration papers or stamped duplicates must be in the sole name of the exhibitor by May 1 of the current 4-H year if the animal was given to or purchased by the exhibitor. If the animal was born to an animal the exhibitor owned and registered, then ownership would start the day the animal was born and any date of registration up to the show is acceptable as long as registration papers are available at check-in. For those that choose to lease, a doe must be leased by May 1 and a lease form must be turned in by June 1 to the Extension Office showing dates of lease. Registration papers are also required to be shown at check-in for leased registered goats. Grade goats must have a breeding affidavit filled out and turned in to the Extension Office by June 1 as well as provide a copy at check-in.

# STATE YOUTH LIVESTOCK nomination deadline for swine, meat goats and sheep is NEAR!

Commercial heifer, market swine, commercial gilts, market lambs, commercial ewes, and all meat goats (market and breeding does) are **due JUNE 15**.

June 15, 2021 is a postmark deadline. Certified mail is suggested. All nominations are sent through campus mail which can add a delay in receipt of your nomination yet another reason to complete this task early. **PLEASE do not to wait till the last minute to** request your animals be tagged or that your nomination forms are signed by an agent. June is a busy month and we don't want to miss helping livestock families properly nominate their livestock.

#### Important Reminders/Suggestions

- Must use the 2021 nomination forms to be accepted
- The 2021 nomination forms are fillable PDF's AND have a 2<sup>nd</sup> page that is a checklist – please double check your nomination.
- Ear notches are required for swine nominations.
- Full Scrapie Tag #'s are required for sheep and goats.
- Cost = \$8.00/animal and checks are to be made payable to KJLS.
- There is a \$20 incomplete fee if any information is missing or any part of the nomination has to be returned.

A nomination does not constitute entry for the show. Kansas State Fair livestock entries are due July 15. Kansas Junior Livestock Show entries are due August 1.

<u>New Centennial Hall 4-H</u> <u>Schedule for 2021</u>

The Kansas State Fair will have a modified 4-H check-in and judging schedule that will begin

prior to the official fair start date. This means that exhibits will need to be delivered to the office earlier than in year's past. Cowley County Extension staff will transport non-livestock and small exhibits to Hutchinson of qualifying purple ribbon exhibits (ages 9 and older). These exhibits will be accepted at the local Winfield office beginning Thursday, September 2 - Tuesday, September 7. Foods and horticulture exhibits will be accepted between 7 - 8 a.m. on Wednesday, September 8. Please package exhibits to keep them safe and secure for transport; entry tags and paperwork will be provided at the Extension Office when you drop off your exhibit.

# Kansas State Fair Livestock Entries

Kansas State Fair Livestock Entries are due to the State Fair July 15. All youth entry forms may be submitted online. However, they must be printed off and signed by authorized agents, parents, and exhibitors before entry form is complete. Entries may be mailed or faxed to: Kansas State Fair, Attn: Competitive Exhibits, 2000 N. Poplar, Hutchinson, KS 67502, Fax # 620-669-3640. Entry information is available at www.kansasstatefair.com. Go to "Competitions", choose "Livestock Competitions" then choose Youth Show Grand Drive (on the right side of the page). Printable entry instructions are available by clicking on "online" registration process. Printable and electronic entries are available.

#### Nominating Livestock for the Kansas State Fair and Kansas Junior Livestock Show

In order to be eligible to exhibit livestock (Beef, Sheep, Meat Goats, Swine) in the Grand Drive of the Kansas State Fair and/or the Kansas Junior Livestock Show, exhibitors must complete the state nomination process found at https://www.asi.k-state.edu/ research-andextension/youth-programs/nominatedlivestock/ Any youth exhibiting at the Kansas State Fair or Kansas Junior Livestock Show must also complete Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) training. If you are a Cowley County 4-H'er wishing to nominate livestock projects for the Kansas State Fair and/or Kansas Junior Livestock Show, you will need to make an appointment with Kelsey (klnordyke@ksu.edu) to have your livestock tagged by state nomination deadlines. YQCA certification can be done online at http:// yqca.org. Additional faceto-face YQCA training may be held after July 4.

#### What Can I Exhibit at the Kansas State Fair??

If your 4-H Age is 9 and older, you are eligible to enter a purple-ribbon exhibit from the Cowley County Fair for judging at the Kansas State Fair in the 4-H Division: photos, food items, gift baskets, educational displays, some notebooks, entomology educational display, entomology collection, clothing construction, horticulture, field crops, floriculture, fiber arts, rabbits, energy management, robotics, rocketry, astronomy, geology collection, geology educational display, woodworking, Shooting Sports educational display, wildlife educational display, poultry, demonstration/ illustrated talk and forestry notebook. Two Senior Division Champions may be selected in Fashion Revue Buymanship and Constructed categories to compete at the Kansas State Fair. Judges will choose six Visual Arts exhibits to be displayed at the Kansas State Fair.

<u>It is the member's responsibility to complete pre-entry</u> <u>by August 13</u> in order to exhibit at the Kansas State Fair. Pre-entries may be made in the 4-H office at the Cowley County Fair or in the Extension Office following the fair.

# 2021-22 Kansas 4-H and FFA Wheat Variety Plot Enrollment



As wheat harvest approaches it is time to remind members to re-enroll or ask new members to enroll for the 2022 Kansas 4-H and FFA Wheat Variety Plot program. The program begins fall of 2021 and goes through September 2022. The enrollment form and program details can be found here: http:// www.kansas4-h.org/events-activities/conferencesevents/wheat/wheat-variety-plots/index.html.

Members are asked to contact their local Extension Office by July 12th for information with enrollments due to Deryl Waldren, dwaldren@ksu.edu by July 23, 2021. There will be no cost for the program in 2021-22 since the five varieties are again being sponsored by commercial companies. It is very important that we know the number of participants early, so we can have enough seed and metal signs available for Extension agents and leaders to pick up at designated places. Location and date details are to be worked out. New participants will receive a free large plot sign, and five free individual variety signs. These are scheduled to be distributed in early September.

Don't forget to pull your wheat samples for the Kansas State 4-H Wheat Show in early August in Wichita, and also for wheat samples at your county fair, that may be eligible for the Kansas State Fair 4-H Crops Division. Resource information for the wheat variety project includes: (1) Wheat Variety Plot Brochure, 4-H 565 Revised 2010,) (2) Wheat Variety Plot-Youth Participant Handbook, 4-H 566, Revised 2010, and (3) 4-H Wheat Variety Plot Record, P1099, Revised 2010.
