#### <u>Self-Regulation and Goal Setting</u> <u>help 4-H Youth Thrive</u>

Thriving youth have their eyes on the future and set goals to get them where they want to go. Selfregulation, or the ability to make choices with a goal in mind, is a key skill for goal setting and a future orientation. Thriving youth are able to make choices and take actions for both short and long-term success, especially when it means letting go of shortterm gratification in exchange for achieving a longerterm goal. Thriving youth also persevere to reach their goals, even when the going gets tough. This perseverence is known as "grit" and research shows that grit is a bigger predictor of success than innate intelligence or ability.

When working with 4-H youth:

- Encourage and help youth to set goals for what they want to achieve. Start with modest achievable goals that gradually get more difficult
- Help youth identify steps they will take to achieve their goals.
- When youth struggle, remind them of the idea of grit, and that with effort, their goals are achievable.
- When youth reach roadblocks to their goals, encourage them to reflect on what didn't work and develop new strategies for achieving the goal.
- Remind youth of the importance of delaying short-term gratification for longer-term goals.
- Recognize youth for the achievement of their goals and the effort they put in to making their goals a reality.

Use the Setting 4-H Goals <u>Worksheet</u> to plan goals for each project area. This will be a helpful tool for the new Kansas 4-H Project Records (which replace the Kansas Award Profile or KAP).

Until further notice, 4-H'ers may complete YQCA online. In-person training **may** be scheduled at a later date in the spring.

#### Livestock 2021

2021 4-H Program Year Tagging Procedures COVID – 19 & Cowley County 4-H FAQs

The following livestock nomination (tagging/ownership) procedures allow for processes based on the level of severity of COVID-19 cases in Cowley County in order to keep our volunteers and participants safe.

Three levels of procedures will be put into place. They are as follows:

**Level 1**: Tagging will take place just like a "normal" year. All county tagging procedures will take place in person. KSRE staff, volunteers and youth participants will observe social distancing and masks must be worn. Beef Tagging: Sunday, March 7; 1:00-3:00 p.m., Winfield Livestock Auction.

All market beef must be weighed and tagged with an official 4-H EID eartag. This includes Second Year Bucket Calf Market Steers and Second Year Bucket Calf Market Heifers.

Commercial (heifers that are not registered with a breed association) must also be tagged with an official 4-H EID eartag by Cowley County Extension Staff. Members are encouraged to bring Commercial heifers to Beef tagging day to be tagged.

Small Livestock Tagging (Sheep, Swine, Meat Goat, Bucket Calves): Tuesday, April 27; 4:00-6:00 p.m., Winfield Fairgrounds.

All breeding and market sheep, swine and meat goats must be tagged with an official 4-H EID eartag. Sheep and Meat Goats will be weighed to establish in initial weight for the rate of gain contest. Families who are unable to attend the tagging in-person, must contact the Cowley County Extension Office in advance to schedule an alternate tagging date. All small livestock MUST be tagged by May 1, 2021.

Bucket calves may be brought to the fairgrounds to be tagged. However, bucket calf tags may also be purchased over the counter and tagged by the 4-H family. Bucket calves must be born between January 1 and May 31 of the current 4-H program year and must be tagged prior to the Cowley County Fair.

**Level 2**: All county tagging procedures will take place in person. However, 4-H families will schedule an appointment for tagging and all 4-H families will be required to remain in the vehicle. Designated volunteers and KSRE staff will tag and/or weigh all livestock. Tagging dates will take place as indicated in Level 1. Families must schedule tagging appointment in advance. **Level 3:** No in-person tagging will take place. All members will be required to complete the Livestock identification form found at https://www.cowley.k-state.edu/4-h/livestock2020.html. Forms must be emailed to klnordyke@ksu.edu. Videos must be uploaded to the private Facebook group for each respective specie.

#### General Rules

Entry is open to any bonafide 4-H or FFA member. Exhibitors must be at least 7 years old and not have passed their 19th birthday before January 1, 2021.

The entry fee is \$30/head by April 16, 2021. After April 16, entry will be \$35/head. Entry fee must accompany the official entry blank. Preentries are preferred. **All pre-entered exhibitors will receive a show t-shirt.** 

Cash awards will be given to the top three Market and top three Breeding animals (\$500, \$300, \$250). Prizes will be awarded for Showmanship and Class winners.

There will be no limit on the number of entries per exhibitor.

Heifer and steer check in begins at 7:00 a.m. All entries must be checked in and weight cards are due by 9:00 a.m. on Saturday, April 24, 2021.

No stalling, no bedding available. Must show off the trailer. Generators are encouraged. Exhibitors are to clean up their area before leaving the grounds.

A minimum of 3 head is required to show as a breed. There will be an AOB class if needed. The show management reserves the right to alter and/or combine classes.

Heifers must be accompanied by registration papers or a copy of transfer papers in the member's name. There will be a commercial heifer class for all unregistered heifers.

Market Steers will show by breed and weight. The Market Heifers will show by weight.

The showmanship contest is open to all exhibitors and will be conducted as follows: Senior (14 and over), Intermediate (10-13), Junior (7-9). Age is determined before January 1, 2021.

There will be a separate Market and separate Breeding class for Cowley County Exhibitors with no entry fee.

The Cowley County Classic will be a full-fit show.

Entry is open to any bonafide 4-H or FFA member. Exhibitors must be at least 7 years old and not have passed their 19th birthday before January 1, 2021.

The entry fee is \$15/head and \$5 per exhibitor for showmanship by April 16, 2021. Entries received after April 16 are \$25/head. All preentered exhibitors will receive a show t-shirt. Entry fee is to defray expenses of the show. No refunds.

Judge's decision will be final.

Animals shown in the market classes are not eligible to show in the breeding classes and vice versa.

Everyone must check in at the registration table prior to weighing. This includes in-county, out of county, breeding and market entries.

Market lambs must be slick-shorn to one quarter inch, to the hock. Wool on the face and below the hock is allowed.

Market Goats will be shown clipped to 3/8" or less. All classes will be split by weight.

All goats must be dehorned or tipped and rounded.

All wethers must be castrated/banded prior to coming to the show. No bucks/rams allow.

The showmanship contest is open to all exhibitors and will be conducted as follows: Senior (14 and over), Intermediate (10-13), Junior (7-9). Age is determined before January 1, 2020. All animals shown in showmanship classes must be owned by the exhibitor.

Classes will be determined by weight and specified by committee. Classes will be determined at the conclusion of weigh-in.

Each exhibitor will be allowed to show only two head in market and two head in breeding classes.

No stalling, no bedding available. Must show off the trailer. Generators are encouraged. Exhibitors are to clean up their area before leaving the grounds.

All lambs must have lamb teeth, all goats must have kid teeth. All sheep and goats must have scrapes tag. No yearling ewes or yearling does. NO MISTREATMENT OF ANIMALS WILL BE TOLERATED.

HEALTH REQUIREMENT: Animals that are ill, have soremouth, and/or "club lamb" fungus **will not be allowed to show.** Decision of veterinarian is final.

The use of artifical coloring, except on hooves is prohibited.

Each exhibitor must groom his/her own animal and may use only the assistance of an immediate family member (mother, father, legal guardian, brother, sister) or another 4-H/FFA member who is an exhibitor at the show.

A special peewee showmanship class for children less than 7 years old will be offered during fitting and showing. \*\*Peewees may ONLY exhibit in fitting and showing.

Goats must be shown with all four feet on the ground. Exhibitors may use a collar, a collar with a short lead or a halter when showing. Medium (3mm) or smaller pinch collars will be allowed.

There will be a separate Market and separate Breeding class for Cowley County Exhibitors with no entry fee.
