Record keeping is (or will be) an important part of a member's life. Members will keep records in high school, in college, and at work whether they own their own business or work for someone else.


Now is the time to learn how to keep good records. The most important thing about 4-H record keeping is to know what records you need to keep and to find a comfortable way to collect information. Some of the most common ways of keeping up with 4-H records include a calendar, smart phone, computer, an index box, computer, or a notebook.

For the 2020-21 4-H Year, the Kansas Award Profile (KAP) has been replaced with the new 4-H Project Report forms available at <u>Kansas4-H.org</u> under the Resources Tab. On the sidebar, select: 4-H Library-> Awards and Recognition->Local Record Keeping & Project Report Forms. Select the appropriate age group (junior, intermediate or senior) and category (animals or general projects).

All families should print a copy of the "Guide to 4-H Project Recognition" that will guide you through the process. Remember, the 4-H Project Records should be completed by the member. 4-H members are encouraged to keep their permanent record throughout the year and complete at least one annual project report.

Start early, create a system to record activities, and take photos. Remember, failures make great stories. We learn from our mistakes!

4-H Development Fund

The Cowley County 4-H Development Fund is a local non-profit 4-H foundation that was created in 1995 to assist Cowley County 4-H'ers as they take part in educational events and activities. 4-H members have benefited from college scholarships awarded annually at 4-H Achievement Night, Leadership Development Grants and camp transportation. Funding comes from gifts and donations of supporters. If a family or other supporter is interested in contributing, information is available in the Extension Office. Increased funding will result in increased opportunities for 4-H members.

Leadership Development Grants

Twenty Leadership Development Grants from the 4-H Development Fund are available to Cowley County 4-H members who are attending a multi-county, state or national 4-H leadership event. \$50 Grants are awarded to applicants who complete the application with essay, write a thank-you to a 4-H Development Fund donor, and provide a leadership program to a Cowley County 4-H club or group. Discovery Days objectives:

- Help youth learn new ideas, techniques, and skills they can use personally and in their 4-H
 clubs or groups and communities

- Enhance personal growth by giving opportunities to develop responsibility, confidence, independence, accountability, problem-solving, decision-making, and time management skills

- Develop college and career readiness skills which prepare participants academically and socially for a successful transition to college and life as an adult

2021 Fair Changes

- •Sheep and Meat Goat check-in will be Wednesday evening from 7pm-9pm
- •Swine unloading on Thursday will travel along the east side of the cattle barn, to the north side of the swine barn and unload at the washracks.
- •Rabbit check-in will be from 6-8pm on Thursday.
- •Beef and Dairy cattle tie-outs will be kept in one area.
- •Exhibitors from both departments are expected to share the tie out area and clean up after themselves after using tie-outs each day.
- •Poultry, Rabbits, Dairy Goats and Bucket Calves will be released Monday by 1pm.
- •Sheep rate of gain contest will be added for 2021. All market lambs must have weighed at small livestock tagging/weigh-in in April.
- •Beef and Meat Goats will exhibit in divisions instead of breed classes.
- •Dairy Cattle rule #3 is changed to: Exhibitor must have owned or leased the dairy animal for a minimum of 100 days before the county fair. All lease, registration and/or transfer papers must be made in the name of the exhibitor and dated no later than June 15 of the current year.
- •Re-word General Livestock Rule #4 to: Exhibitors are limited to exhibiting a total of 4 head in each specie. Exception: Beef and Dairy Cattle may exhibit 5 head including Dairy Cow and Beef Cow/Calf pair. However, the Dairy Cow of Beef Cow/Calf pairs will not stay at the fair due to space restrictions.

Nominating Livestock for the Kansas State Fair and Kansas Junior Livestock Show

In order to be eligible to exhibit livestock (Beef, Sheep, Meat Goats, Swine) in the Grand Drive of the Kansas State Fair and/or the Kansas Junior Livestock Show, exhibitors must complete the state nomination process found at https://www.asi.k-state.edu/research-and-extension/youth-programs/nominated-livestock/

Any youth exhibiting at the Kansas State Fair or Kansas Junior Livestock Show must also complete Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) training.

Small Livestock Project Health Tips:

Worm on a monthly basis March 1, April 1, May 1, June 1, July 1. Be sure to rotate wormers and check the label for withdrawal information.

Use a feed specially formulated for your livestock specie and NOT an "all-stock" feed.

Weigh on a regular basis and hand feed according to your animal's needs. Each specie has a minimum weight they must meet in order to sell in the premium sale.

Swine: 230-290 pounds Sheep: 95 pound minimum Meat Goat: 50 pound minimum

Water is the most important nutrient you provide your livestock. Make sure that plenty of fresh, clean water is always available. Clean water buckets/troughs regularly.

Start an exercise program. Practice leading/driving, tying, setting up your livestock regularly.

South Central District Horse Show

The South Central District Horse Show is scheduled for Thursday, July 1, 2021 at the Kansas State Fairgrounds in Hutchinson, KS. The District Horse Show is the qualifying event for horse project members that wish to exhibit at the Kansas State Fair 4-H Horse Show. In order to participate at the District Show, members must have completed the Level 1 Kansas 4-H Horse Level Test. Entries are due June 15, 2021. Exhibitors should complete the online registration at https://kstate.qualtrics.com/jfe/form/SV_1RZHi55M517yBgi they will be invoiced via PayPal for their fees.

Levels Testing:

- All levels testing must be complete by June 15.
- The \$10 fee (\$5 for exam and \$5 for riding) will still apply. This will be sent in with the signed coversheet upon the successful completion of the online test.

- The leadership section will include: online club meeting talks/demonstrations, virtual horse judging or clinic, Panorama, etc.

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) is a national, multispecie quality assurance program for youth ages 8-18. The program promotes food safety, animal well-being and character development. With YQCA, you'll discover what it takes to be an informed producer, consumer and employee of the agriculture and food industries.

Who is required to take YQCA?

Youth ages 8-18 who intend to exhibit Swine, Sheep, Beef or Meat Goats at the Kansas State Fair and/or Kansas Junior Livestock Show must be YQCA Certified. Youth showing livestock both locally and at state shows are encouraged to take YQCA training. Youth may attend an in-person, instructor led training or an online web-based training.
