Cowley County Fair

The Cowley County Fair is scheduled for July 28 - August 1. **Pre-Entries will** be online and due Wednesday, July 6. The 2022 official fair rule book will be mailed out in June (online access earlier), with instructions on how to pre-enter.

4-H Development Fund

The Cowley County 4-H Development Fund is a local non-profit 4-H foundation that was created in 1995 to assist Cowley County 4-H'ers as they take part in educational events and activities. 4-H members have benefited from college scholarships awarded annually at 4-H Achievement Night, Leadership Development Grants and camp transportation. Funding comes from gifts and donations of supporters. If a family or other supporter is interested in contributing, information is available in the Extension Office. Increased funding will result in increased opportunities for 4-H members.

Leadership Development Grants

Twenty Leadership Development Grants from the 4-H Development Fund are available to Cowley County 4-H members who are attending a multi-county, state or national 4-H leadership event. \$50 Grants are awarded to applicants who complete the application with essay, write a thank-you to a 4-H Development Fund donor, and provide a leadership program to a Cowley County 4-H club or group. Development Fund Scholarship

Are you interested in an Academic Scholarship? This year the 4-H Youth Development Fund will be awarding three \$500 Scholarships. 2022 Fair Changes

- 1. Dairy Cattle will be released and must be taken off the grounds at 1:00 p.m. Monday.
- 2. The top 5 market livestock will be selected in each market specie. The top 5 livestock will sell at the beginning of the sale order for each specie in the market livestock sale.
- 3. Livestock judges will place the top 3 senior showmen for each specie. The preference order for showman who compete in multiple species will be Dairy Goat, Dairy Cattle, Swine, Sheep, Beef, Meat Goat, Horse. The order will rotate annually.
- 4. A bred and owned class will be added for Beef, Sheep, Swine and Meat Goat in both the market and breeding divisions. Animals entered in the Bred and Owned class must be the offspring of a dam owned by the 4-H'er prior to breeding, during gestation and after birth of the animal.
- 5. New General Livestock Rule #32: All male livestock (beef, sheep, swine, meat goats) must be castrated at least 30 days prior to the fair and must be healed completely.
- 6. Dairy Goats must be owned or leased by May 1 of the current 4-H year.
- 7. Change Dairy Goat Rule #8 to: Dairy goats may have hay in their pens. The hay must be in a hay bag and kept away from Meat Goat and Sheep pens. NO HAY NETS.
- 8. New Food and Nutrition Class #0415- Enhanced Baking Mix Product
- 9. Lego projects are removed from the Visual Arts division and will be in the 4-H STEM-Architectural Block Construction.
- 10. Ag Mechanics is under STEM- Ag Mechanics with additional classes

Favorite Foods Contest & Decorated Foods Judging

NEW for 2022. In an effort to protect and preserve decorated food entries, judging for 4-H decorated foods has been moved to Tuesday, July 19 at Cowley College's Brown Center. This will also be an opportunity for youth to enter exhibits for the Favorite Foods Contest. Learn more about this contest on the Cowley website. This is the same day as 4-H Clothing and Fashion Revue judging.

Project Leaders

In order to serve as a project leader, one must complete the Volunteer Screening Process which includes: Volunteer Service Application, background check, enroll yearly as a volunteer in ks.4honline.com and appointment by the local unit board.

Nominating Livestock for the Kansas State Fair and Kansas Junior Livestock Show

In order to be eligible to exhibit livestock (Beef, Sheep, Meat Goats, Swine) in the Grand Drive of the Kansas State Fair and/or the Kansas Junior Livestock Show, exhibitors must complete the state nomination process:

The state livestock nomination process is transitioning to an online system this year! This will require families to plan ahead in order to successfully complete their nominations. Moving to an online system will streamline the process from nomination, to show entry, through participating in the state shows. The deadlines have not changed.

The new process includes four (4) primary steps:

- 1.) Purchasing Official DNA Envelopes in Advance through ShoWorks
- 2.) Submitting Animal & Exhibitor Information Online
- 3.) Mailing DNA Envelopes with Submission Receipt
- 4.) Extension Agents & FFA Advisors Approving Nominations Online

Families will need to purchase an official DNA envelope for each animal by the order deadline, which is one (1) week prior to the nomination deadline. This will be April 24 for market beef and June 8 for small livestock and commercial heifers. Old envelopes will not be accepted. Exhibitors will be prompted to upload their family's 2022 Declaration Form and current YQCA certificate during the online submission process. A child's certificate needs to be good through 10/2/2022 to be valid.

Families are encouraged to send their nominations via certified mail. The deadlines have not changed. Market Beef nominations are due May 1. The Small Livestock and Commercial Heifer Deadline is June 15. These dates include submitting the information online through ShoWorks and postmarking the appropriate DNA sample(s). Late nominations will not be accepted. All families, regardless of experience level, are encouraged to read through the Rookie Guide and use the other resources available in 2022!



Any youth exhibiting at the Kansas State Fair or Kansas Junior Livestock Show must also complete **Youth for the Quality Care of Animals** (YQCA) training. Online YQCA training is available at https://yqcaprogram.org/.

Small Livestock Project Health Tips:

De-worm on a monthly basis March 1, April 1, May 1, June 1, July 1. Be sure to rotate wormers and check the label for withdrawal information.

Use a feed specially formulated for your livestock specie and NOT an "all-stock" feed.

Weigh on a regular basis and hand feed according to your animal's needs. Each specie has a minimum weight they must meet in order to sell in the premium sale.

Steer/Heifer: 1,050 pound minimum

Swine: 230-290 pounds Sheep: 90 pound minimum Meat Goat: 50 pound minimum Rabbit Meat pen: 3-5 pounds each

Water is the most important nutrient you provide your livestock. Make sure that plenty of fresh, clean water is always available. Clean water buckets/troughs regularly.

Start an exercise program. Practice leading/driving, tying, setting up your livestock regularly. For additional help with your livestock project, contact one of your superintendents or email Sarah (slag11@ksu.edu).
