



ENTRIES WILL NOT REQUIRE YOU TO ENTER THE LEG BAND NUMBERS AT TIME OF PRE-ENTRY. IF YOU KNOW THEM PLEASE ENTER THEM AS IT WILL HELP WITH A QUICKER CHECK IN. IF YOU DO NOT KNOW WHICH BIRDS YOU ARE BRING YET YOU CAN SKIP ENTERING LEG BAND NUMBER AT ENTRY AND DECLARE LEG BAND NUMBERS AT CHECK IN.



If you are bringing birds in with bigger species make sure the vets look them over at the green star to bring them on grounds. You are able to take your birds to your campsite if needed until check in time. You will still need to bring your birds to the gold star <u>first</u> for check in. <u>All</u> birds will need to be PT Tested.

No birds will be allowed in or around pens or area until they have been tested/vet checked and checked in by superintendents.

MEAT BIRDS WILL BE JUDGED ON THE BASIS
OF MARKET VALUE, MARKET QUALITY AND
UNIFORMITY OF THE THREE BIRDS IN THE PEN.

BIRD SELECTION



CHOOSE HEALTHY BIRDS: SELECT BIRDS FREE FROM DISEASES AND PARASITES. THIS ENSURES GOOD PHYSICAL CONDITION, BRIGHT PLUMAGE(FEATHERS), AND PREVENTS POTENTIAL SPREAD OF ILLNESS AT THE SHOW



EVALUATE TEMPERAMENT AND TRAINABILITY: PICK BIRDS THAT ARE COMFORTABLE WITH HANDLING AND TRAINING. PRACTICE GENTLE HANDLING AND EXAMINE THEM ROUTINELY TO BUILD TRUST AND GET THEM USED TO BEING HANDLED BY UNFAMILIAR PEOPLE LIKE JUDGES.



IDENTIFY POTENTIAL SHOW BIRDS EARLY: START SELECTING AND PREPARING BIRDS MONTHS BEFORE THE SHOW. THIS ALLOWS TIME FOR TRAINING, CONDITIONING, AND ADDRESSING ANY ISSUES.



SELECTING BIRDS TO EXHIBIT SHOULD FOLLOW "THE AMERICAN STANDARD OF PERFECTIONS". BIRDS NOT MEETING STANDARD WILL BE LOWERED ONE RIBBON PLACING. CHECK RECOGNIZED BREEDS.

CONDITIONING AND DIET



PROVIDE APPROPRIATE HOUSING: KEEP SHOW BIRDS SEPERATE FROM THE MAIN FLOCK IN A CLEAN ENVIRONMENT TO MINIMIZE THE RISK OF INJURY AND ENSURE THEIR FEATHERS REMAIN CLEAN.



OPTIMIZE THEIR DIET: A HIGH-QUALITY DIET TAILORED TO THE SPECIFIC NEEDS OF YOUR BREED IS IMPORTANT FOR MAINTAINING OPTIMAL HEALTH AND FEATHER QUALITY. CONSIDER USING A SHOW FEED SPECIFICALLY DESIGNED FOR SHOW BIRDS.



SUPPLEMENTATION: CONSULT WITH EXPERIENCED BREEDERS OR POULTRY SPECIALISTS ABOUT POTENTIALLY USING SUPPLEMENTS LIKE DRIED SEAWEED OR BREWER'S YEAST TO ENHANCE FEATHER QUALITY AND OVERALL HEALTH, BUT BE MINDFUL OF POTENTIALLY CAUSING DIGESTIVE ISSUES



MARKET MEAT BIRDS BE AWARE OF WITHDRAWL DATES ON FEED.

GROOMING



BATHING: BATHE BIRDS WITH LIGHT: COLORED PLUMAGE 3-7 DAYS BEFORE THE SHOW. USE A THREE-TUB SYSTEM WITH WARM WATER AND SUITABLE SHAMPOO. FOLLOW WITH A VINEGAR RINSE TO REMOVE SOAP RESIDUE.



DRYING: WRAP BIRDS IN A TOWEL AND LET THEM AIR DRY IN A CLEAN, DRAFT-FREE ENVIRONMENT. ALTERNATIVELY, BLOW DRY ON LOW HEAT FOR FASTER DRYING, PARTICULARLY FOR LOOSE-FEATHERED BREEDS.



MAKE SURE THEY ARE DRY!! DO NOT TRANSPORT AND BRING WET BIRDS TO THE SHOW. THIS CAN BE VERY DANGEROUS FOR BIRDS.



TRIMMING: TRIM TOENAILS AND THE UPPER BEAK IF NEEDED, AVOIDING THE QUICK



SHINING: APPLY A SMALL AMOUNT OF BABY OIL, OR CASELINE TO THE COMB, WATTLES, EARLOBES, SHANKS, FEET AND TOES FOR A POLISHED LOOK. USE A SILK CLOTH TO RUB FEATHERS FOR A NATURAL SHEEN.

SHOW PREP



TRANSPORT SAFELY: USE A SECURE, ADEQUATELY SIZED CARRIERS WITH VENTILATION. FOR LONG JOURNEYS, CONSIDER PROVIDING WATER ACCESS AND TAKING BREAKS



FINAL TOUCH-UPS: BEFORE JUDGING, DO A FINAL CHECK FOR CLEANLINESS, ESPECIALLY FEET AND FEATHERS AROUND THE VENT. WIPE CLEAN WITH A DAMP CLOTH OR WIPES



HYDRATION: ENSURE BIRDS HAVE ACESS TO WATER IN THEIR CAGES DURING THE SHOW. ASK YOUR SUPERINTENDENTS WHAT THE SUGGESTED WATERING DISHES ARE TO LOOK THE BEST, PROVIDE LESS MESS AND STILL WORK EFFICANTLY



MINIMIZE STRESS: HANDLE BIRDS GENTLY, PROVIDE FAMILIAR FOOD AND WATER.



IT IS VERY IMPORTANT TO KEEP A CLEAN AND TIDY AREA FOR THE ANIMAL AND VIEWING PUBLIC.



ALL FANS OR ANY ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT MUST HAVE THREE WIRE GROUND NOT TOUCHING METAL. NO BATTERY OPPERATED FANS ALLOWED.

POST SHOW



QUARANTINE: ISOLATE SHOW BIRDS FROM THE REST OF THE FLOCK FOR AT LEAST 14 DAYS AFTER RETURNING HOME TO PREVENT POTENTIAL DISEASE TRANSMISSION




DUSTING: CONSIDER DUSTING SHOW BIRDS WITH FLEA POWDER AFTER RETURNING FROM THE SHOW AS A PREVENATIVE MEASURE.



FOLLOWING THESE STEPS, YOU CAN HELP ENSURE YOUR POULTRY IS HEALTHY, WELL CONDITIONED, AND READY TO SHINE AT THE SHOW. REMBEMBER THAT INDIVIDUAL BREEDS MAY HAVE SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS, SO IT'S ALWAYS A GOOD IDEA TO CONSULT BREED STANDARDS AND EXPERIENCED BREEDERS FOR TAILORED ADVICE.
